Summary of Activities

Firstly, I'd like to thank the funders of COI Phase 2, which began July 1, 2004 and will continue for 18 months:

- Canadian Organic Growers
- Capers Community Markets
- Cawston Cold Storage
- Nature's Path Foods
- SunOpta Inc.
- Organic Sector Development Program (AAFC/BCMAFF)

I'd like to thank Gunta Vitins, who volunteered her time to do the difficult job of fundraising for this project.

I spent much of July trying to get the funding and OSDP application organized for COI Phase 2. I worked with the CGSB to try to ensure the Canada Standard Part 1 received a positive vote. This meant sending a letter to all the voting members of the standard committee.

Meeting with CFIA

On July 15 I met (via teleconference) with Dick Fadden, President of the CFIA, along with Greg Orris, Director of the Bureau of Food Safety and Consumer Protection and Daniel Deserendean, Director of Food of Plant Origin Division. The call was brief. Dick began by stating that he understood I was anxious that the regulatory process appeared to have stalled. I replied that we had a short window until Dec. 2005 and that my industry funders like to see results.

The short story from the CFIA was that they were waiting to see what the new Minister of Agriculture wanted to do. Concerning the EU deadline, Dick stated that Industry Canada is working on a plan for an interim equivalency agreement. He committed to calling me the next week to provide an update. He also committed to letting me know what they are doing about the cost/benefit analysis as I had asked about that.

Dick Fadden sent me a message on August 8th:

This is a further update. We have agreed with AAFC on the funding of the cost-benefit analysis and we are proceeding with this as soon as is practicable. There is also agreement that we should proceed to put into place the regulation drafting team and we are moving now to do so. Once a project manager is in place, I will ask him/her to touch base with you. Hope this is helpful. Rgds. Dick Fadden

Regulation Options

The issue of different options for an organic regulation came up within the ORC. As a result of this discussion I developed a regulatory options paper. This paper is a brief overview of different places the organic sector could look for a national organic regulation.

Response to this exercise from the ORC was mostly negative. The committee (those who responded) did not see the need to deviate from the course we had spent the last year developing and made it clear that they wished to go forward, not backward.

I drafted and sent a letter to the new Minister of Agriculture, Andy Mitchell (attached).

Meeting with Michael Presley

On August 9 I met with Michael Presley, Director General Food Value Chain Bureau, AAFC and Mark Zeigler, Deputy Director Horticulture and Special Crops Division, AAFC, along with Tracey Inness, Marketing and Trade Officer, AAFC. The meeting was in the new COABC office in Vernon.

I provided the AAFC with a brief update of the organic regulation initiative and suggested that the ORC was feeling that the government was losing interest in the issue. Michael replied that there was lots of work going on behind the scenes. He said that the AAFC has committed over \$500,000 towards the development of an organic regulation over the next 18 months. AAFC will develop a position at the executive level with authority for an organic regulation team within the AAFC and the CFIA. AAFC will also create two administrative positions that will be devoted (fulltime) to the organic regulatory effort.

ORC Teleconference

The ORC met via teleconference on August 10. The committee members were pleased to hear the result of the meeting with Michael Presley and the positive vote on the Canada Standard. We discussed the next steps and set meeting dates for September 24 at the Canadian Health Food Association Show in Toronto: www.chfa.ca/expoeast.php and the Organic Connections Conference, November 8th, 2004 in Saskatoon: www.organicconnections.ca

Canada Standard

The ballot for the Canada Standard Part 1 passed as follows:

- 33 of 41 ballots returned
- 24 votes yes
- 7 votes no
- 1 abstention

According to CGSB policy, the Canada Standard Part 1 (Organic Principles) has been approved by vote. All the comments must still be acknowledged and editorial changes (where needed) made. After this is accomplished, the Standard will be approved.

Parts 2 (Guidance to Part 1) and 3 (Permitted Substances List) of the Canada Standard have been sent out for comment. The comments have been received and must be acknowledged and changes made. Then Parts 2 and 3 will go out to ballot.

Next Steps

I will be attending an International Federation of Organic Agricultural Movements (IFOAM) and Organic Materials Review Institute (OMRI) Organic Networking Summit on Skagit Bay (near Seattle) on September 17th.

I will be attending the CHFA Expo East organic sessions and participating in Organic Day (September 24). The morning and afternoon sessions are open to the public and are free. As lunch is included you must register before the event (by September 10th) with Anne Wilkie: awilkie@chfa.ca Please attend if you can as this will be an opportunity to speak with both the ORC and government. I'll be spending much of September preparing for the three events I will be participating in.

I have been appointed to the CGSB organic standard working group so I will be working with the other members to resolve the errors and come up with an approved standard.

Dear Mr. Mitchell,

Congratulations on your appointment as Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada. Canada's organic farmers and agri-food handlers are pleased that you have been selected to lead this ministry and optimistic about the future relationship between the Canadian organic sector and the government of Canada.

The Organic Regulatory Committee (ORC) is a group of 18 leaders of the organic farming and handling sector in Canada. The ORC was appointed by the Canadian organic sector meeting, at the Guelph Organic Conference in January 2003. The mandate given to the ORC is to "...develop and ensure implementation of a mandatory system for organic in Canada that meets the needs of the stakeholders".

The Canada Organic Initiative Project (COI) supplies co-ordination for the ORC. The organic industry and government have provided funding for the COI:

- Canadian Organic Growers
- Capers Community Markets
- Cawston Cold Storage
- Natures Path Foods
- SunOpta Inc.
- Organic Sector Development Program (AAFC/BCMAFF)

During the past 18-months, the ORC has brought the organic industry together towards a common goal - involved all regions and aspects of the sector in the process. We have identified the need for an organic regulation:

- Consumers are confused by unclear labelling
- Trade is being affected
- Organic imports are not controlled
- No control of fraudulent designations in the Canadian market

The ORC has worked closely with AAFC, the CFIA, and International Trade Canada to develop a model for an organic regulation, provide stakeholder consultations across the country and to begin assessing the costs and benefits of a regulation. The organic industry is united on the need for an organic regulation and there is clear incentive for this project as the deadline for trade access to the EU (Dec. 31, 2005) approaches.

The development of a Regulation is necessary for the expansion of the organic sector in Canada. We urge you to support the initiative for an organic Regulation and we look forward to a successful collaboration with your Ministry in the process. In this regard, we ask for the opportunity to meet with you as soon as possible.

CAN/CGSB-32.310 – Organic Production Systems, Part 1: General principles
(Second Committee Ballot Draft, June 2004; Letter ballot No. 32/20-4)

The letter ballot tally is as follows:

CAN/CGSB-32.310	33/41 (80%)	25 (61%)	7 (17%)	1 (2%)	8 (19%)

The collation of the ballots and comments from voting members is enclosed. The comments were copied as received in French or English and are currently being translated and will be distributed as soon as completed. Proposed resolutions to negative ballots and comments are currently being developed by the Committee Chairperson, the working group and Secretary, and will be distributed for your consideration as soon as they are available.

Approval of a draft standard is by consensus. Consensus is substantial agreement by concerned interests involved in the preparation of a standard. It includes an attempt to resolve all objections and implies much more than a simple majority, but not necessarily unanimity. It requires that all concerned interests are given the opportunity to be heard and to convince their fellow committee members of the validity of their case. A valid consensus also requires that, of the members entitled to vote, at least 60% return their ballots and at least 50% vote affirmatively.
